Access to free online tutoring in more than 60 subject areas is also available through the library's website.

SNAP program

Are you eligible to participate in state or federally-financed work-study this school year?

Or, do you have an expected family contribution (EFC) of \$0 this academic year? I

f so, you may be eligible to receive aid through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)!

Under regular SNAP rules, students enrolled at least half-time in an institution of higher education are not eligible for SNAP unless they meet an exemption. However, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021 has temporarily expanded SNAP eligibility to include students who are work-study eligible or have an EFC of \$0.
